



Amendment to Drop-In Guidelines Effective February 5, 2022

At the scheduled ending time of any drop-in session, the drop-in session is over. Players whose paddles remain in the saddle at that time do not have special privileges related to continued use of those courts.

The courts used for that drop-in session roll over to their next use according to the schedule.

- If a reservation or other scheduled use is "next up" on a court, that court should be yielded promptly at the end of the drop-in session.
- If there is not a reservation that is "next up" on a court
 - Any resident (including someone who had just been playing drop-in) may "stake their claim" to that unreserved court (just as would be done for any other open court slot on the daily reservation grid) by placing paddle(s) against the fence near the court entrance and waiting nearby.
 - If no one has claimed the unreserved court, the players in current drop-in game, if any, may continue using that court. If someone has claimed the court, they should ensure that the group on the court is aware and can expect to take over the court at the completion of the game currently in progress.
